RON'S REFLECTIONS

I'd like to take a few minutes today to reflect on a trip I took with six men last week to North Carolina. The purpose of our trip was to respond in obedience to the word of God and to the Holy Spirit's nudging of our hearts to help those neighbors in need who have been devastated by the recent Hurricane Helene.

At the beginning of this trip several of us knew each other to some degree. Others who traveled with us had not met each other before the trip. This made for interesting interaction on the nearly 8-hour trip as we were in close quarters of two pickup cabs and there was plenty of time to talk, to ask questions and get to know more about each other's lives, families and experiences.

The newness in our relationship was quickly overshadowed by the more similar feelings we began to experience collectively as we encountered the high degree of devastation to the region that we drove through as we drew near to Ashville. It is frankly hard to put into words.

In many ways it was an ideal week to get to know each other and form bonds of friendship as we witnessed together the results of the hurricane, found our way to the air bnb and to and from project sites, discussed, planned for and picked up material from Lowes, then interacted, shared Jesus, financial blessings, words of encouragement and prayed with those living in the trailers we winterized.

Because hungry men must eat, we also prepared numerous meals together, had many discussions ranging from theology, hunting, flying, sports, families, food, Ping-Pong, and sleep habits while working and serving long days in all kinds of weather. All this activity, mixed with lots of wit and humor and lots of ribbing, effectively enabled us to grow to know each other better which resulted in a meaningful and memorable week of building one another up in our faith and cultivating friendships newly forged to the glory of God.

As scripture says "Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!" Ps 133:1 It was truly a wonderful experience. I also want to put this out there that these brothers who travelled to North Carolina are serious about their faith and exhibited it in their cheerful willingness to work hard, to serve, their openness to studying and discussing the scriptures together, and their eagerness to listen to, share and pray with one another and for those we served.

So, a heartfelt thank you to Brian Johnson, Matthew Cymbal, Trey Boyd, Paul McCartney, Lee Kurtzman, Tom Sawyer, for taking time off and making this selfless trip, and to Wanda's brother Robert Swartzentruber, who travelled in from Knoxville on Tuesday night with ice cream, a van load of foam board, gorilla tape, and portable heaters to donate to the relief effort. You guys are awesome!

Each of us felt to some degree the pull to either stay on longer or to at least not forget those who have been severely affected by Helene. Let us continue to mind the Lord and the Spirit of God as he leads, guides and prompts us to love our neighbors as ourselves. Love ya!



In Acts 20, Paul offers a deeply personal and powerful example of discipleship and leadership as he bids farewell to the Ephesian elders. His actions and words provide a blueprint for how leaders can disciple others with integrity, humility, and love.

1. Serve with Humility and Perseverance (Acts 20:19-21)

Paul reminds the elders of how he lived among them, serving the Lord with humility and enduring hardships. He boldly proclaimed the Gospel to Jews and Gentiles alike, teaching repentance and faith in Christ.

• A disciple-maker must lead by example, showing humility and perseverance even in the face of trials. Are you modeling a life that reflects Christ to those you disciple?

2. Prioritize the Mission Above Personal Comfort (Acts 20:22-24)

Paul expresses his willingness to face imprisonment and hardship for the sake of completing the task the Lord gave him: testifying to the Gospel of God's grace.

 Discipleship involves sacrifice. Are you willing to put God's mission ahead of your own comfort or preferences? How can this inspire those you mentor?

3. Guard the Flock Faithfully (Acts 20:28-31)

Paul charges the elders to keep watch over themselves and the church, warning them of false teachers who will try to lead the flock astray. He emphasizes the importance of vigilance and shepherding.

• Discipleship includes equipping others to stand firm in their faith and discern truth from error. How are you helping those you disciple guard their hearts and minds?

4. Be Generous and Selfless (Acts 20:33-35)

Paul reminds the elders that he did not covet anyone's possessions and worked hard to support himself, setting an example of generosity and selflessness.

• True discipleship is about giving, not taking. How can you practice generosity—of time, resources, and love—with those you disciple?


5. Lead with Love and Prayer (Acts 20:36-38)

As Paul kneels to pray with the elders, they weep and embrace him, showing the deep bond of love and respect between them. This moment underscores the relational aspect of discipleship.

• Discipleship is not just about teaching; it's about building meaningful, Christ-centered relationships. How are you showing love and praying for those you disciple?
