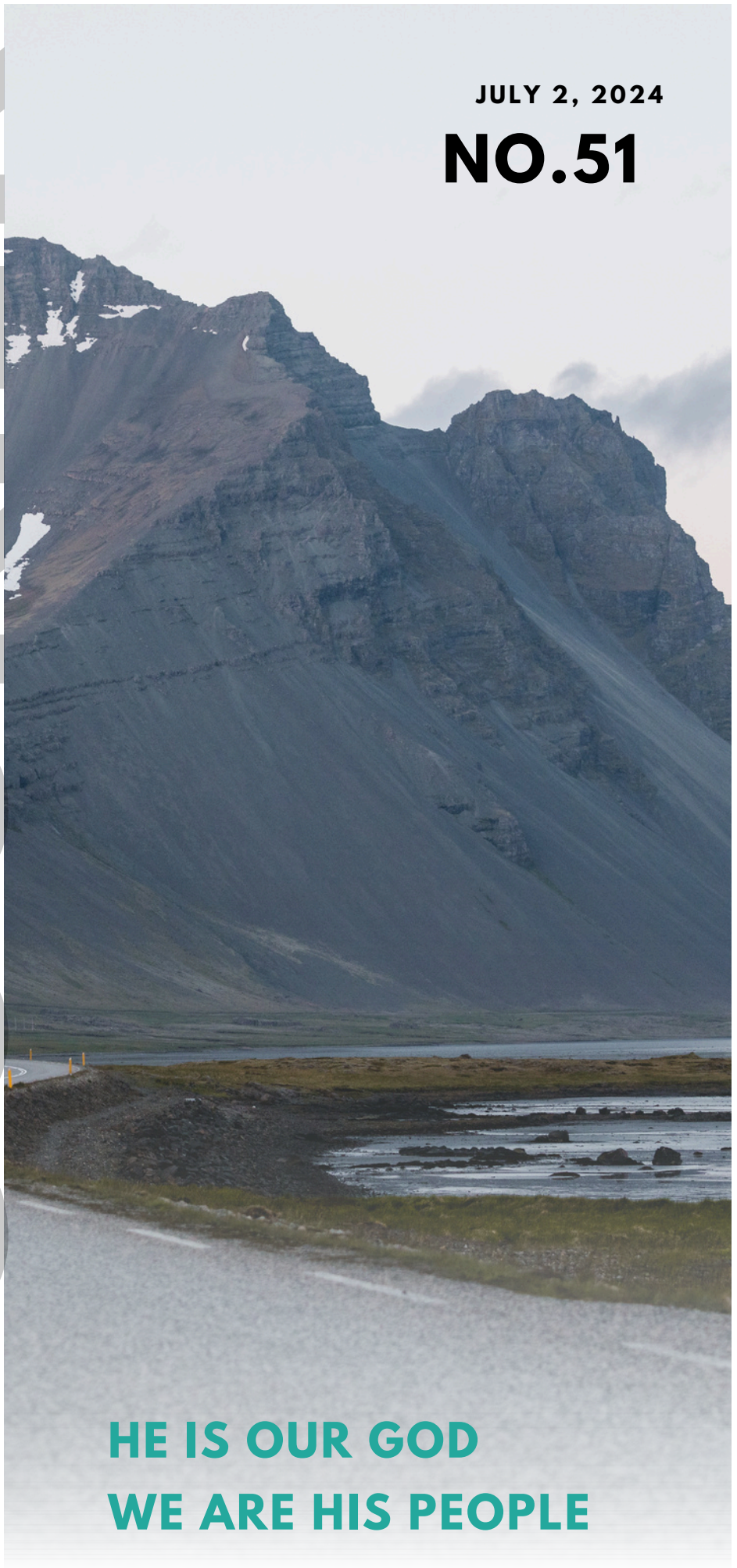

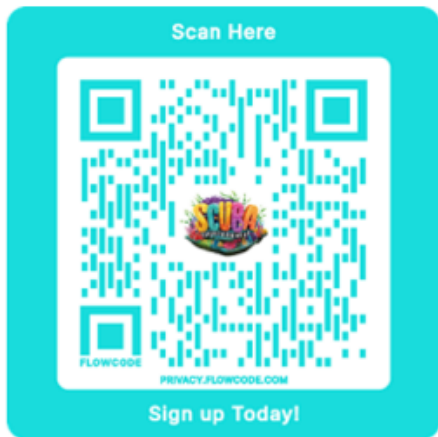

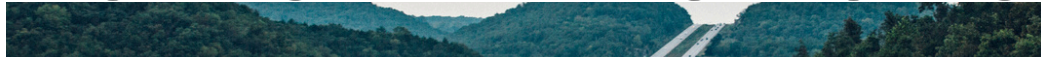

RON'S REFLECTIONS



Life in Hartville continued...During this time of pursuing a degree as a non-traditional student at Malone, our two oldest boys, Derek and Kevin were enrolled in Lake Center Christian School. Derek began second grade and Kevin entered kindergarten. Derek caught the attention of the superintendent Matt McMullen with his achievement test scores and Matt called us in for a conference. I'll never forget when he asked us the question, "do you know what you have here with Derek?" I responded saying that I knew he seemed very bright. Matt then pulled out the test scores to show that Derek as a second grader was reading and understanding material at a post 12th grade level. Matt then wanted to know where he got such intelligence and concluded that it must have been from Wanda 😊.

Now Kevin, well let's just say, that he was into school too, but his goal was to embrace the social side of everything! His kindergarten teacher was concerned and recommended that he repeat kindergarten to master the academic fundamentals. We felt he would excel if he continued without being held back for a second run at it and praise God he did! In first grade Kevin grasped the academic side of things very well and had no issues going forward. During this time Kevin also battled chronic tonsillitis. Once we addressed that in our first year of living in Hartville, Kevin's health drastically improved for which we were so grateful!

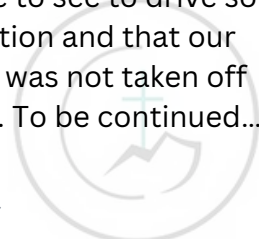
Wanda had her hands full with four young children and me. She often helped me type up some of my papers that I was required to write, while keeping house, handling the many and varied needs of our four kids and even taking on a baby-sitting job for a young boy Crystal's age named Adam. Her work was nonstop, and I was and am still amazed to this day how she accomplishes so much and does it all so pleasantly.

Eugene Miller and Vernon Sommers took me under their wings and invited me to go with them deer hunting. Vernon gifted me my first buck hunting knife which I treasure to this day. It has come in handy multiple times for gutting and skinning the deer I've been able to bring down. Eugene showed me many things about the way of the deer, and the best way to either still or stand hunt them on their property down just off Poker Road. Those times with Eugene and Vernon, were some of my favorite times during those early years in Hartville. Vernon also took me and our two boys to see our first Cleveland Indians game.

Life on the farm on Andrews Street was an adventure for all of us! During that first year, we experienced our first tornado. One afternoon, the boys had come home from school, little 2-year-old Crystal was upstairs for her afternoon nap, and Wanda had taken the car and run to town for a few minutes out of the house, which was her way of catching a short break, to pick up a few needed groceries.

I remember looking out at the threatening greenish skies and wondering if we were in for a serious storm when suddenly, the wind in the open windows turned to a screaming sound like a freight train's whistle and the back door to the deck flew open. Torrential rain was moving horizontally past the opening. I ran to the door, and it was all I could do to wrench the door shut as the tornado took out the top of the tree next to the house and wrapped our new trampoline around the bottom of the next tree. The buggy barn about 100 feet east of the house took the full brunt of the destructive force of the tornado and large parts of it were scattered in a circular way up to a thousand feet out in the field. The only thing remaining was our little Simplicity riding mower parked undamaged on a small concrete slab in the center of where the buggy barn had been. The tornado continued to wreak havoc for a few miles as it moved east and left many twisted off trees and residential damage in its path.

Wanda was in the car coming home and the tornado crossed just in front of her. She was unable to see to drive so she stopped the car and waited for it to pass. To this day I am so thankful to God for her protection and that our house stayed together. Little Crystal slept through it all upstairs in her crib. Thankfully the roof was not taken off or she may have been injured or killed. God's angels certainly watched over our family that day. To be continued...

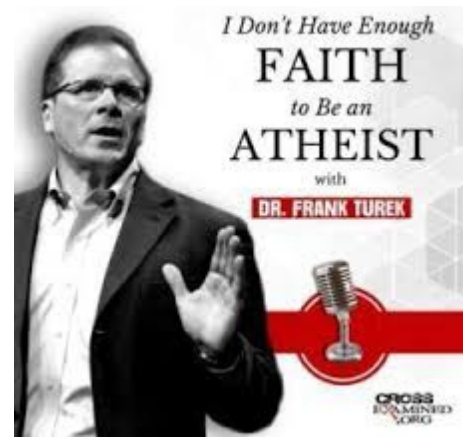

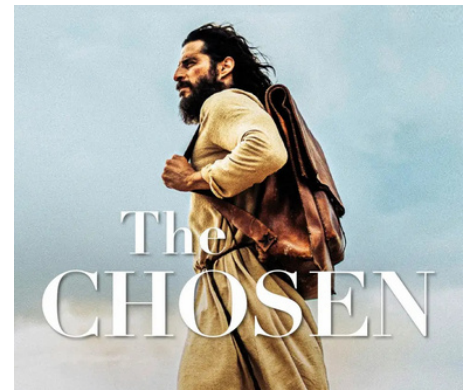

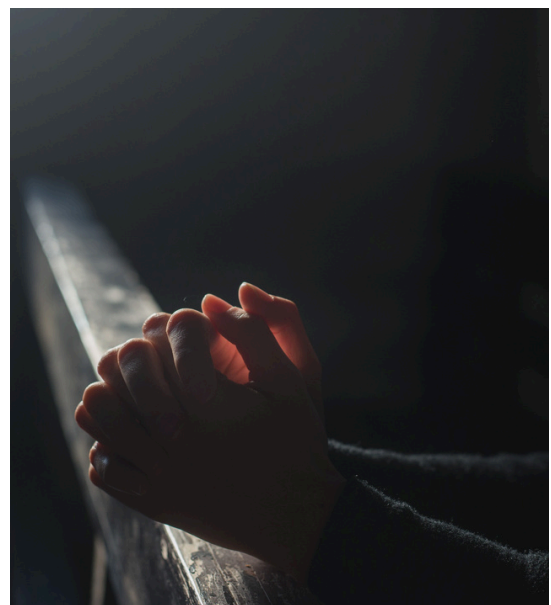
