RON'S REFLECTIONS

The theme of the first Sunday of Advent is "HOPE" As we think about this hope, we are reminded that we need a hero in our lives and this hero is the promised Savior, Jesus Christ.

You see, each of us live out a micro story of the macro story of humankind every day. We each awaken to a day that seems untouched by our own human failure. Our first thoughts are about what an ideal day before us will look like. However, sometimes even by our second thought, or just as soon as we rise from the bed, we realize that that ideal day is not going to happen. Maybe it is because physical pain is triggered by a worn-out joint, or maybe the heart ache of yesterday's failures comes crashing in. The day that began perfectly, has taken a losing turn and instantly we realize how badly we need a hero to save us from ourselves or from the situation in which we find ourselves at that moment.

Isaiah the prophet brought a tremendous message of hope to all nations when he spoke of a coming hero to a nation devastated through judgement for its own neglect and disobedience to God.

In Isaiah 11:2-3 Isaiah describes the hero as follows: "And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD." This description of the Spirit of God that was to be upon the coming Hero or Savior is one that shows the completeness of the Holy Spirit. Take a moment to meditate on those character traits!

To sum it up, Jesus Christ, when he laid aside his glory and took upon himself the form of a selfless, yet courageous man who was empowered by the Spirit of the Almighty God is this much needed hero. And this selfless lesus laid his life down that you and I can experience a win due to all the promises of God.

This God designed void in each of our hearts is in search of a Hero, something or someone who can save the day for us. Sadly we, along with most of society continue to seek to fill that void with imperfect heroes just like ourselves or with the material possessions that are advertised as if they could complete us. We spend Thanksgiving focused on trying to be grateful for our material possessions, rather than the steadfast love of the Father shown to us through sending us our much-needed Hero in his Son, Jesus Christ!

Consider yourself along with the millions who tune into some kind professional sport every day, hoping to see the hero on the team emerge to save the day with a win. It feels so good when "our" team wins! Or think about the estimated one trillion that will be spent in the US this Christmas season to feel better about ourselves. We are desperately in need of a Hero. Repeatedly our days and years, our relationships and our dreams have not turned out as we hoped. Yet, for 6000 years the promise of a Messiah, God's hero for us, has been proclaimed by the ancients and by proclaimers of the gospel today. Are we listening?

Christ has come, he came with the Spirit and with power. He fulfilled the promises of Isaiah then and now. His promises are yes and amen! His invitation stands for us today by saying: "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." Christ is the Hero you are looking for. Come to him today. Don't spend another minute or Advent season without him! Love ya!

From now until December 15th, we are gathering gift cards for our Giving Tree.





When Jesus sent His disciples out to preach, He prepared them not only for success but also for rejection. Matthew 10:14 reminds us that rejection is part of the journey of sharing the Gospel. Jesus' instruction to "shake the dust off your feet" is both a practical and symbolic gesture, teaching us to trust God with the results and remain faithful.


In Matthew 10, Jesus sends out His disciples to preach, heal, and proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is near. The disciples were instructed to rely on God for provision and focus on their mission without fear. What does it mean to be faithful in sharing the Gospel, even when it's not well-received?

Jesus acknowledged that not everyone would accept their message. Rejection of the Gospel is not a rejection of you personally but of Jesus and His message. How should we respond when people refuse to listen or dismiss the message of Christ? Think about this.

In biblical times, shaking off the dust was a symbolic act indicating a separation from those who rejected God's message. It is not a sign of anger but a declaration that you've done your part, and the rest is between them and God. Our responsibility is obedience, not outcomes. Even when faced with rejection, trust that God is working. Some plant, some water, but God gives the increase (1 Corinthians 3:6-7).

Ask God to strengthen your heart when faced with rejection and to give you wisdom in sharing the Gospel. Success in God's kingdom isn't measured by numbers but by obedience. Focus on faithfulness and to be on mission for Him.
