

RON'S REFLECTIONS

Yesterday afternoon, at the gentle invitation and persistence of my good friend Brian Johnson, I dug out my ole cross bow, a few arrows, my hunting knife, my hat, my hunting boots and then spent the next several hours sitting out in the forest near my home. Frankly, I had forgotten what a treat it is to step away and spend time in the woods during this time of year.

As I settled in, nestled between the branches of some deadfall, I soon became aware of the sounds of the forest. The almost constant patter of acorns falling all around me was something I'm not sure I've ever heard quite like I heard yesterday. There was also a bit of a breeze that was rustling the leaves and causing those ready for their final journey from limb to land to break free and gently fall.

The longer I sat the more I began to see the activity of the forest community. The calls and chirps of the many kinds of birds flitting and feeding in the branches and rustling among the multi-colored leaves. Then there were the squirrels both grey and black with their fluffy tails bouncing out the back as they scampered up and down the trees and across the branches in search of whatever squirrels look for and carry back to their secret hiding places. They were certainly entertaining!

Of course, I was there in hope of seeing a nice buck or big doe come walking through the woods on the way to or from the water or nosing around the forest floor in search of a good meal of fresh acorns. It is the beginning of the rutting season and so I was also hoping a big buck might be not quite as cautious and also a bit distracted on his way past my hiding place.

Now, I have not hunted for more years than I care to admit, so it was good to be back among the trees, sort of like coming home to a once familiar environment. But what really felt good was to have that chance to take an interactive view of the "living handiwork" of my heavenly Father's creation! Fall is such a beautiful time of year, yet it is unique in the sense that I get the distinct feeling that an era or season is ending and yielding to another season just as dynamic, and it is happening before right in front of not just my eyes but all my five senses. To hear, to smell, to see and to touch the beauty God has made is awesome! Fall is the season where seeds/acorns fall and are buried, and new life will begin again!

Last Sunday, the text for the sermon was Ephesians 3:14-21. I titled the sermon "Rooted, Grounded and Flourishing." Paul, through prayer, was praising God and interceding for ALL those who had been made alive through the acceptance of The Good News of the Gospel of Christ Jesus. Paul prayed that the believer would know the width, the length, the height and depth of the love of Christ.

To grasp a better understanding for me or for the believer, the analogy of spending time in the forest can be explored and applied. For me to know, experience and appreciate the forest, I first need to respond to the invitation. Then I must stop what I am doing, I must go there, I must get quiet, I must sit still and watch, I must listen and learn. Then and only then can I really begin to see, benefit from and enjoy the dynamic life cycle and culture of the forest all around me.

For me to know, experience and appreciate the width, the length, the height and the depth of God's love requires the same. I must decide to stop what I am normally doing; I must come into his presence and his word. And as I read, I must get quiet, I must watch, I must listen and learn in every season of life to truly experience God's dynamic power that touches every aspect. Finally, I must open my eyes to behold the beauty of his handiwork and be amazed that I am able to flourish on this journey to which he has called me because of the magnitude of HIS love for me and for all of us. 




MEN'S BIBLE STUDY
