

#### **RON'S REFLECTIONS**

Last Wednesday I travelled with a few brothers from local churches to southeastern Kentucky and spent the night with some friends that were made during the rebuilding effort following the flood two years ago in the Breathitt County region. As we sat with the gentleman who gladly put us up for the night, we reminisced with him and listened to him recount some of the incredible stories that had come out of the experience. So much loss of life and possessions, and so much heart ache was experienced there among the locals. The next morning, we stopped in to see another gentleman and his wife who had also lost nearly everything due to the raging river that ravaged their house and land on that fateful night. One phrase in their stories was spoken repeatedly, "God is merciful and faithful."

Our journey was not over, and we travelled on towards Asheville and the surrounding region. Our destination was the town of Spruce Pine that was recently hit hard by hurricane Helene. It was truly difficult to comprehend the extreme and increasing level of devastation that we encountered from about 40 miles north of the town and it was ongoing until we reached our destination. I've seen lots of flood damage before, but this vast amount was truly mind boggling. My heart hurt and I felt nauseated as I thought about the terror and trauma that so many individuals and families had and continue to experience in the western North Carolina and east Tennessee region. The weather is changing, winter is coming.

Helene's extreme rainfall, 36-40 inches, combined with high winds had literally combed the trees from many of the mountains, swept away many homes, possessions, displaced miles of railroad tracks, roads and bridges. And 40 days later, chain saw crews are still one of the number one requests as there are still roads and properties that need clearing. Slowly but surely roads and bridges that were blocked and washed out are being cleared and rebuilt. Remaining houses and stores are being mucked out as the local population begin the hard work of recovery and rebuilding. Disaster relief organizations like Samaritan's Purse and Baptists on Mission are reaching the point of transition from recovery to emergency rapid rebuild. They want to get as many people as possible out of tents and back into a portion of their own homes before winter sets in. Volunteers are needed!

We were privileged to be assigned one of the first rebuild projects by the organization that put us up for the nights we were there. So we spent Friday, insulating and drywalling where water had damaged the inside of a house, and insulating the floor of the same house in a 30" crawlspace still wet and muddy. Yet, during all this, we witnessed something else. We witnessed the compassion of Jesus in action.

We were privileged to see the hands and feet of Jesus. People of all ages from all over the country, have lovingly and sacrificially laid their normal lives and schedules down to come and serve the Lord by doing the dirty, hard, back breaking labor of helping their fellowman recover and rebuild. Others offered their skills and talents by working to prepare meals for displaced people and the volunteers. Still others used their administrative skills to register volunteers, manage the donations, oversee tool distribution, assess damage on houses, operate a medical clinic, give neck and back massages to the workers in the evenings, do laundry, and prepare meals for 150 people out of their own kitchens several times a week. The work is far from over. Even as the horror of September 26-27 fades in the minds of those unaffected, we want to help and facilitate others who would also be interested in being the hands and feet of Jesus. There are many ways to get involved. We are looking for camping trailers in good condition to send down as well as coordinating teams of volunteers to go spend a several days or a week soon. 



#### "ONLY A DISCIPLE CAN MAKE A DISCIPLE." - A.W. TOZER

In Matthew 4:18-22, along the shores of Galilee, Jesus saw two fishermen, Simon and Andrew, casting their nets. He called to them, saying, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." Without hesitation, they dropped their nets and followed. Moments later, Jesus called James and John, and they too left everything behind. These ordinary men answered Jesus' call to a new purpose, walking alongside Him, learning from Him, and ultimately carrying His message to the world.

This story reminds us that discipleship begins with a willingness to leave behind what is comfortable to follow Jesus' call. Just as those first disciples were invited into a mission greater than themselves, we, too, are called to step out of our routines, follow Jesus with full commitment, and share His message with others. Their obedience and courage transformed them into people who would change the world—a mission we are invited to continue today.

Being a disciple means following Chirst and encouraging and training others to do the same. Jesus' mission continues today through us, His followers, and He commissions each of us to make disciples wherever we are. This passage reminds us that the call to discipleship is also a call to make disciples—just as the early disciples received, they then gave. In our own lives, we're called to pour into others, guiding and encouraging them to follow Jesus. When we step into this mission, we participate in a legacy that changes lives and reaches into eternity.

**Challenge**: Consider who in your life may be seeking mentorship. Who have you approached to offer discipleship? This week, reflect on who comes to mind and make an effort to reach out. If no one stands out, take a moment to pray and ask God to help you identify someone.


